1 John 1:1 That which was from the beginning, which **we** have heard, which **we** have seen with **our** eyes, which **we** looked upon and have touched with **our** hands, concerning the word of life— 2 the life was made manifest, and **we** have seen it, and testify to it and proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and was made manifest to **us**— 3 that which **we** have seen and heard **we** proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with **us**; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. 4 And **we** are writing these things so that **our** joy may be complete. 5 This is the message **we** have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. 6 If **we** say we have fellowship with him while **we** walk in darkness, **we** lie and do not practice the truth. 7 But if **we** walk in the light, as he is in the light, **we** have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses **us** from all sin. 8 If **we** say **we** have no sin, **we** deceive **ourselves**, and the truth is not in **us**. 9 If **we** confess **our** sins, he is faithful and just to forgive **us our** sins and to cleanse **us** from all unrighteousness. 10 If **we** say we have not sinned, **we** make him a liar, and his word is not in **us**.
