### THE HEART OF THE SON

Luke 15:11 And he said, "There was a man who had two sons. 12 And the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of **property** that is coming to me.' And he divided his **property** between them. 13 Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took a journey into a far country, and there he squandered his **property** in reckless living.

- 1. The younger son WALKED away from a father he didn't understand.
  - a. The younger son viewed "property" (oủoíα // ou-SI-a) as something to SPEND on himself.
  - b. The father viewed "property" ( $\beta$ ío $\zeta$  // BI-os) as something to SHARE together.

Luke 15:14 And when he had spent everything, a severe famine arose in that country, and he began to be in need. 15 So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed pigs. 16 And he was longing to be fed with the pods that the pigs ate, and no one gave him anything. 17 "But when he came to himself, he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have more than enough bread, but I perish here with hunger! 18 I will arise and go to my father, and I will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you. 19 I am no longer worthy to be called your son. Treat me as one of your hired servants."

- 2. The younger son viewed his relationship with his father as TRANSACTIONAL
  - a. His identity (how he saw himself) PRODIGAL Son

Luke 15:19 I am no longer worthy to be called your son....

b. His outlook (how he related to others) - OUTSIDER

Luke 15:19 ... Treat me as one of your hired servants.

c. His ethic (his rule of life) - LICENSE

Luke 15:13 ...he squandered his property in reckless living

Luke 15:16 And he was longing to be fed...

Luke 15:17 ... I perish here with hunger!

Philippians 3:19 Their end is destruction, **their god is their belly**, and they glory in their shame, with minds set on earthly things.

### THE HEART OF THE FATHER

Luke 15:20 And he arose and came to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt **compassion**, and ran and embraced him and kissed him.

- 1. The father was watching and waiting for his son to COME HOME.
- 2. The father's heart was full of COMPASSION, not conditions.

Luke 15:21 And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' 22 But the father said to his servants, 'Bring quickly the best robe, and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet. 23 And bring the fattened calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate. 24 For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found.' And they began to celebrate.

3. The younger son was lost BEFORE he ever left.

#### ASK YOURSELF:

•Is my perspective on God being supported or challenged by His word?

### THE CALL TO COME HOME

Luke 15:1 Now the tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to hear [Jesus]. 2 And the Pharisees and the scribes grumbled, saying, "This man receives sinners and eats with them."

Luke 5:29 ...and there was a large company of tax collectors and others reclining at table with them. 30 And the Pharisees and their scribes grumbled at his disciples, saying, "Why do you eat and drink with tax collectors and sinners?" 31 And Jesus answered them, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. 32 I have not come to call the righteous but sinners to repentance."

- 1. Jesus doesn't validate, celebrate, or placate our SIN.
- 2. Jesus FORGIVES our sin and helps us FORSAKE it.

John 10:10 ... I came that they may have life and have it abundantly.
