### STORY POINT:

David believed God's promises.

### CHRIST CONNECTION:

God promised David's family would be full of future kings forever. God's promise came true in Jesus. Jesus came from David's family and is the King of everything forever.



Read: 2 Samuel 5; 7

## Bible Story Recap:



- David became the new king of Israel. He lived in a big palace, and He wanted to build a house for God and God's special box.
- God spoke to a prophet named Nathan. God said, "I did not ask for a house. Instead, I promise David's family will always have kings."
- David was amazed by God's promise. He said, "God, You are so good! You are awesome! Please make Your promise come true so everyone will know how great You are forever."
