STORY POINT:

We gain wisdom when we trust in God.

CHRIST CONNECTION:

Solomon taught that people should trust in God. Jesus trusted in God, His Father, and followed His plan by coming to earth to die on the cross for our sins. Jesus rose again. When we trust Him, we have forgiveness and life with God forever.



Read: Proverbs I; 3-4

Bible Story Recap:



- King Solomon was very wise. He wrote down wise sayings called proverbs. Proverbs help us know how to do what is right and good.
- Solomon said, "Remember to respect God. Only foolish people ignore wisdom and don't like being told what to do."
- Solomon also said, "My son, follow my rules and you will live a long, happy life. Be kind to others. Trust God with all your heart. Stay away from what is wrong. Don't get mad when God corrects you. He loves you like a father who wants to teach his children."
- Solomon said, "I am showing you the best way to live."

Ask any leader in our children's ministry to give you a list of Bible storybooks or resources needed in the ministry.


