# DEVOTIONAL

## ELIJAH CONFRONTED AHAB

### STORY POINT:

God showed He is the one true God.

### CHRIST CONNECTION:

The fire came down to show the people of Israel that the Lord is God. When Jesus came to earth, the Holy Spirit came down like a dove to show that Jesus is God's Son.



Read: I Kings 18-19

## Bible Story Recap:



- King Ahab was a bad king. He and many of the people prayed to a pretend god named Baal. But Elijah loved the real God. Elijah told King Ahab, "Let's have a contest to see who the real God is."
- They set up a contest. The people who prayed to Baal asked for fire, but nothing happened. Then Elijah asked God for fire, and God sent fire from the sky! Everyone saw that the Lord is the real God.
- King Ahab was mad, so Elijah ran away. He was tired and prayed to God. God whispered to Elijah and told him there was still work to do. Elijah listened and did what God asked.

## Make it Fun:



Set up a soda challenge for your family. Serve each family member two small cups of different brands of soda, but don't tell them which soda is in each cup. Share the taste test results with the family and talk about how Psalm 34:8 tells us to taste and see that the Lord is good. Remind kids that the God of the Bible is the One True God and there is no one like Him!


## Big Question & Answer
