ELISHA THE PROPHET

2 Kings 2; 4-5

Big Picture Question: Why do Christians continue to sin? *Christians continue to sin because we still have a sin nature, but when Jesus returns, He will make us sinless like Him.*

Main Point: God spoke through the prophet Elisha and gave him power to perform miracles.

Day 1: READ → 2 Kings 2:1-12

READ & DO → Elijah was a prophet, or messenger sent by God, to deliver important news to people. Elijah passed on his abilities and blessings to his follower, Elisha. Elisha was an eager learner who followed his leader. Who is someone in your life that teaches you things?

Since this lesson involves learning from a teacher, play a simple "follow the leader" game, choosing one person from your family at a time to guide the rest of you through activities or steps. You might also play "Simon says" and substitute the title for "Elijah says."

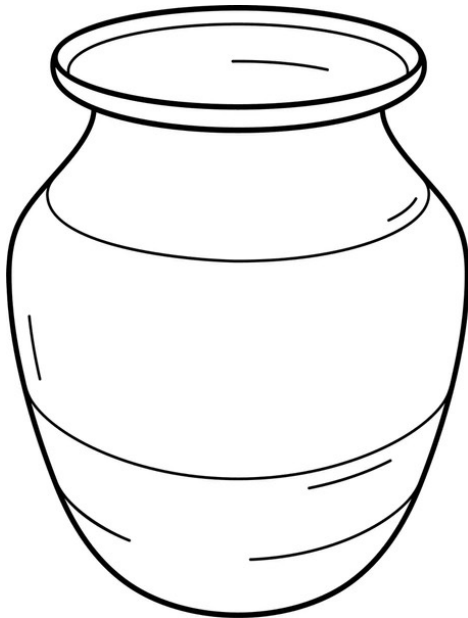
PRAY → Father God, help me listen to my teachers and leaders in my life by understanding their role in leading me. Amen.

Day 2: READ → 2 Kings 4:1-7

READ & DO → Oil was very precious in Bible times. Ask your parent to place a little olive oil in your hand for you to feel and smell. God did a miracle by not allowing the widow's oil to run out.

Day 3: READ → 2 Kings 4:8-37

READ & DISCUSS → A wealthy woman had an extra room built onto her house and furnished it comfortably for Elisha. In thanks for her help in preaching the word of God, Elisha told the woman that she would give birth to a son even though her husband was very old. She did give birth to a son, but after a few years, he died. The woman placed the boy's body in Elisha's special room and then went to find Elisha. Elisha came and raised her son from the dead.

Discuss the following questions.

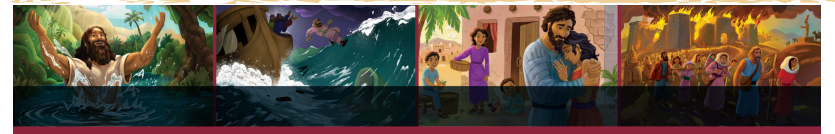
What do you think Elisha's room looked, felt, or smelled like?
