GOD PROMISED A NEW COVENANT

STORY POINT:

God promised forgiveness to those who trust in Him.

CHRIST CONNECTION:

The people couldn't follow God's rules perfectly, so God made a new promise. When we trust in Jesus, we are part of this new promise, and God's teachings are with us forever.



Read: Jeremiah 17; 31

Bible Story Recap:



- God sent a helper named Jeremiah to talk to His people because they were doing wrong things.
- Jeremiah said that if people trust in God, they will be strong like trees, but sometimes our hearts can trick us.
- Jeremiah explained that we need God's help to do what is right because doing things our own way leads to sin.
- Jeremiah shared happy news: God was going to make a new promise to His people, saying, "I will be your God, and you will be My people. I will forgive your sins."

God is holy, good, and loving.


Big Question & Answer
