## GOD PROMISED A NEW COVENANT

*Jeremiah 17; 31*

**Big Picture Question:** What is God like? *God is holy, good, and loving.*

**Main Point:** God promised His people a new covenant and forgiveness of sin forever.

## Day 1: READ → Jeremiah 17:5-10

**READ & DISCUSS** → Can you tell the differences between these two branches?



Flowers are really important on some trees. Do you know why? Before a tree grows fruit, it has to grow flowers. Once the flowers grow, the fruit will grow after it.

In today's reading, God compares people to these two branches. He says that the person who only trusts other people to help him and give him support is like this branch. He will be all dry and brittle. He will not see the good things in his life. He will always want more and more and always worried about everything.

But, the person who trusts in God, who believes God will help him, will be like this branch. He will receive many blessings from God. He will not be worried or afraid of anything because he knows that he can trust God and God will take care of him no matter what happens.

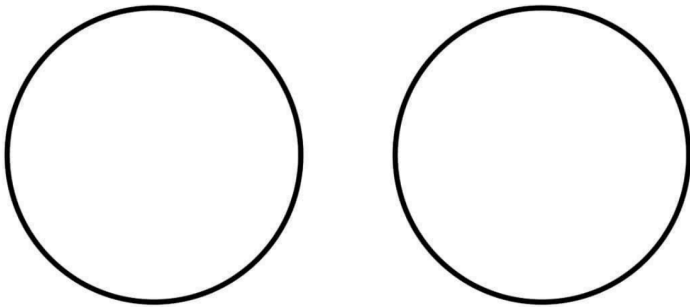
**PRAY** → *God, help me grow strong like a healthy tree with lots of leaves and beautiful flowers that turn into fruit. Amen.*

### Day 2: READ → Jeremiah 31:1-6

**READ & CIRCLE** → God promises to rebuild his people, that they will once again celebrate with joy (like planting vineyards and dancing), and that a time will come when they will all gather to worship God together in Zion. Draw a sad face on the left and a happy face on the right.



This passage emphasizes God's "everlasting love" for his people. Even though God's people had a hard time, God promises they will "again take up their tambourines and go out to dance with the joyful".

**PRAY** → *God, the sadness always passes and joy comes. Thank you for your everlasting love. Amen.*

### Day 3: READ → Jeremiah 31:7-14

**READ & DO** → Opposites are things that are completely different from one another. Complete the opposites below.

Wet → \_\_\_\_\_

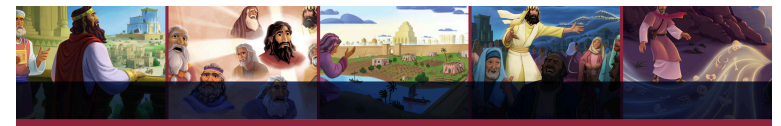

When you're feeling sad, do you ever wish that you could suddenly be happy? We can't just flip a switch and change how we feel. We all have times when we get sad. The good news is that we know someone who does have the power to change our hearts and emotions. The Lord gives us joy even when we don't feel too happy. The prophet Jeremiah told the people that God had plans for reunion and restoration. Even though there was pain and sadness to face, it wouldn't last forever. Jeremiah described people who would dance with joy, and sorrow that would turn into gladness. There was hope in difficulty.

**PRAY** → *God, help me rejoice in your presence even in times when I feel sad. Amen.*
