STORY POINT:

Ezra taught God's law to His people.

CHRIST CONNECTION:

Ezra taught the people about God's rules. Jesus also taught about God's rules, but Jesus did even more—He followed all of God's laws perfectly, died for our sins, and came back to life!



Read: Ezra 7-10; Nehemiah 8

Bible Story Recap:




- The walls around Jerusalem were finished, and everyone gathered to hear Ezra read God's Word.
- The people listened carefully, thanked God, and worshiped Him together.
- Helpers explained God's words, and the people felt sad because they were not obeying God.
- Ezra told them not to be sad and encouraged them to have a feast and be happy because God makes them strong.
- The people celebrated by having a feast and making little tents, remembering how God took care of their families long ago.

Throw a party to celebrate God's work in your family. Decorate, serve cake, and sing worship songs as a family. Take turns telling stories and naming specific things God has done for you this past year
