Nehemiah 1-6

Big Picture Question: What is the Bible about?
The Bible is the story of God's plan to save people through Jesus.

Main Point: Even though their enemies tried to stop them, God's people rebuilt the walls.

Day 1: READ → Nehemiah 1:1-11

READ & PRAY → Nehemiah hears that Jerusalem's walls are broken and prays to God for help. When Nehemiah heard bad news, he didn't panic or complain—he **prayed**. What's something that makes you sad or worried right now? How can you pray about it like Nehemiah did? Write a prayer giving your worry to God.

Day 2: READ → Nehemiah 2:1-8

READ & WRITE → Write about a time you were nervous to ask for something, but it turned out okay?

Nehemiah was sad in front of the king, and the king asked why. Nehemiah told him about Jerusalem—and the king said yes to rebuilding! Nehemiah was brave enough to speak up, and God helped him.

PRAY → *God, give me courage to speak up when I need help, even when I feel scared. Amen.*

Day 3: READ → Nehemiah 3:1-12

READ & LIST → Everyone helped rebuild the wall—families, priests, and workers side by side. The people worked **together**. God loves teamwork! Make a list of who helps you follow Jesus...
