DEVOTIONAL

JOHN BAPTIZED JESUS

STORY POINT:

John baptized Jesus.

CHRIST CONNECTION:

Jesus obeyed His Father by being baptized. Baptism reminds us that Jesus died and came back to life. People who turn from their sins and trust in Jesus should be baptized too.



Read: Matthew 3; Mark 1; Luke 3; John 1

Bible Story Recap:



- Jesus went to see John at the Jordan River. When John saw Jesus, he said, "Here is the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!"
- Jesus wanted John to baptize Him. But John tried to stop Jesus. John said, "Why do You want me to baptize You?"
- John was confused. He baptized people who turned from their sins. Jesus never sinned! Jesus said, "God says this is right." So, John baptized Jesus.
- When Jesus went up from the water, the heavens opened, and the Holy Spirit came down on Jesus like a dove. A voice came from heaven that said, "This is My Son. I love Him, and I am very happy with Him!"
