## JESUS' FIRST FOLLOWERS

### STORY POINT:

Jesus chose disciples to follow Him.

### CHRIST CONNECTION:

Jesus came to be our King. He died on the cross and rose again to save us from our sins, and He calls us to follow Him. Everyone who follows Jesus is His disciple.



Read: John 1

## Bible Story Recap:



- John was with two of his followers. He saw Jesus and said, "Look, the Lamb of God!" The two men left John and followed Jesus.
- The men wanted to know where Jesus was staying. "Come and see," Jesus said. They stayed with Jesus that day.
- One of the men who followed Jesus was Andrew. He found his brother, Simon, and brought him to Jesus. Jesus said, "You are Simon. You will be called Cephas" (which means "Peter").
- Then Jesus found Philip and said, "Follow Me."
- Philip told Nathanael about Jesus. "Come and see," Philip said. Nathanael met Jesus and said, "You are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!"

Serve:

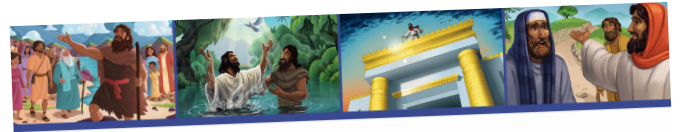
