STORY POINT:

John told people to follow Jesus.

CHRIST CONNECTION:

John the Baptist told people to follow Jesus. When people follow and believe in Jesus, they receive eternal life and can point others to believe in Jesus too!

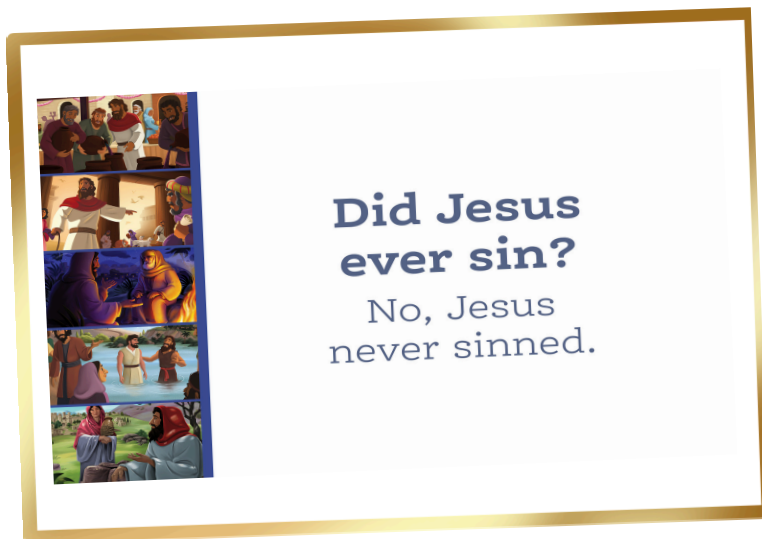


Read: John 3

Bible Story Recap:



- John the Baptist's followers saw that people were following Jesus. John told them, "I told you I am not the Messiah. My job is to go ahead of Him and announce that He is coming."
- John told them to think about a wedding. A groom marries the bride, but the groom's friend stands by the groom and is happy for him. John felt like the groom's friend. John was happy that Jesus had come.
- John said, "Jesus must become greater, and I must become less." Then he said, "Whoever believes in Jesus will live with God forever. Whoever does not believe will not live forever."



Make it Fun:



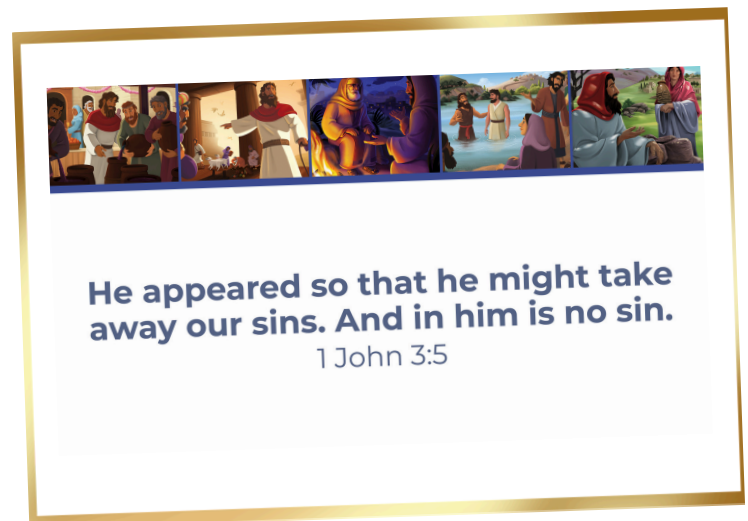
Use poster board and other craft materials to make giant foam fingers for each family member. Cut them out and decorate them with messages like Jesus is #1!, He must become greater, or Point to Jesus! Talk about how John the Baptist didn't try to be the most important—he pointed people to Jesus instead. Share ideas about how you can each "point to Jesus" this week—at school, work, or in your neighborhood.

Big Question & Answer

Serve:



Ask friends and neighbors to help your family host a Bible club in your neighborhood this spring. Plan three or four Bible stories to share with kids, come up with lesson plans and activities, and designate an individual to start gathering supplies. Consider hosting the Bible club in a front yard or nearby park to help other kids learn about Jesus. Remind your family that this is just one of the ways we can point others to Jesus the way John pointed people to Jesus.
